POLLINATION AGREEMENT

a) The beekeeper shall supply the grower with hives (colonies) of honey bees to be
delivered to
as follows:

The beekeeper shall locate said bees in accordance with directions of the grower, or, if none are given, according to his/her judgement in providing the maximum pollination coverage.

Disease-free colonies with a laying queen as evidenced by brood
frames with brood
frames covered with adult bees
frames of honey stores or other food
story hives
If the grower doubts that the colonies meet the minimum standard.*, the beekeeper agrees to open and demonstrathe strength of colonies <u>randomly</u> selected.
In the event of a dispute concerning bee number or health, a neutral third party with a good working knowledge of beekeeping shall be called in to make an examination of questionable hives within 10 days of date hives are place at the crop.

If such examination proves colonies to be weaker than the standard, on average, it is agreed that the contracted

Some Beekeeper and Grower Do's and Don'ts
Notice unexpected colony removal; call the beekeeper
Notice rain water accumulation around the hives; call the beekeeper
Turn entrances toward the field, away from roads.
Establish flight paths and locations away from dwellings, parking lots, vehicular and foot traffic.
Avoid shady locations and low spots.

Provide "drives" for bee trucks and specific, enlarged "bee drops" in the field.

Discourage drifting by marking hives, spacing hives irregularly, or providing landmarks in the field.

Choose "staging" areas carefully. High densities of homes won't tolerate hundreds of hives nearby.

Avoid excessively travelled roads that cross flight path, especially at passenger level.

Avoid pesticide losses to your beneficial pollinators, including honey bees.

Do not move beehives during daylight hours Do not move colonies less than 5 km.
