






Canadian Honeybee Industry 2016

 Overwinter Bee Losses (Canada)*

- 2009: 33.9%

- 2016: 16.8%

- 2017: 25.1%


- 2018: 32.6%

For 2018, the most frequently cited causes of loss in order from high to low were: weather, poor queens, weak colonies in the fall and starvation

Canadian Best Management Practices for Honey Bee Health

 Content ranging from regulations for pest and disease treatment thresholds to management of colonies during pollination services

Planting Forage for Honey Bees in Canada

-A guide for farmers, road and utility managers, and gardeners

Consolidated Reference of Practices to Reduce Bee Poisoning from Agricultural Pesticides (NEW)

- A guide to enhance the cooperation between growers and beekeepers

Canadian Beekeepers' Practical Handbook to Bee Biosecurity and Food Safety

- Provides information that is helpful for beekeepers who are interested in exporting their honey to international markets



Labelling (front of package, nutritional and country of origin)

- CHC successful in avoiding honey to have front of package label on sugar content
- Partial success on identifying country of origin in blended honey, label will list in accordance of most to least
- New nutritional will be available shortly after cooperating with large industry players



Antimicrobials access and delivery

- Not all provinces are the same
- Not all vets are qualified
- Urban and hobby beekeepers could be affected hardest
- Cost are undetermined
- Implementation December1, 2018



Public trust/social license

- Does it pit small vs large operations?
- Whose voice counts?
- What does the public believe?
- Environmental or economic?
- How to engage the consumer?
- Huge growth in urban beekeeping



Food safety/ biosecurity (SHB)

- Biosecurity affects interprovincial transport which affect domestic stock security
- Safe Food for Canada Act and licencing all food production
- Development of a national surveillance program



Adulteration and transhipping

- Biggest international issue and impacts everyone
- NMR testing in Canada
- CFIA co-operation and the need for import and export testing and certification



Labour

- Biggest issue facing commercial operations
- Introduction of biometric testing of TFW's this year




Creation of a Marketing Site across Canada for Stock Replacement

- Canadian producers will be able to post what they have for sale (queens, Nucs)
 - List of individual producers by province
- Reasoning
 - 11 million is spent annually on importing Queens and nucs
 - Increase in those wishing to produce Queens and Nucs
 - Easier to find Canadian Northern stock


